## Welcome from The Chairman



**S**hropshire Junior Football League (SJFL) has come a long way since it started in the 1973/74 season with 25 teams in 3 divisions for U13, U14 & U16 age groups. This year SJFL celebrates 40 years of providing junior football with a turnover of £20,000, 23 Charter Standard clubs, 167 teams from U8 to U16 and over 2300 players enjoying safe and friendly football every fixture week. The League started as the Shrewsbury & District Sunday Junior Football League, changed name to the Shropshire County Sunday Junior Football League in 1982 as it spread across the county, before becoming the SJFL in 2006. In 1999 the league embraced Shrewsbury Town FC as a football partner and moved its HQ from the Telepost Club to the Gay Meadow and then to the Greenhous Meadow new stadium in 2007, where we still reside today.

SJFL was the first county league (2002) to implement a Code of Conduct in its rules and regulations and Turner Peachey became the first official league sponsors in 2006, as they still remain, supporting the Respect Programme. 2009 was a big year, starting with SJFL becoming the FIRST affiliated league in England to be accredited as Charter Standard by The F.A., with a presentation at Wembley Stadium. The year finished with the league being the first to implement a mid-season winter break for mini-soccer with a Futsal festival held at Shrewsbury Sports Village and a presentation by The Mayor of Shrewsbury for services to football in the community. This festival was so successful that it is now in its sixth season.

The McDonalds Community CS League awards for Shropshire & West Midlands were presented to the league in 2010 and for the next 3 seasons to 2013. We implemented 9v9 football for the U11 age group in 2011 and in 2012 for both U11 and U12 groups. Currently 40 teams and over 500 participants now play 9v9 football.

As an affiliated Respect League, SJFL was recognised for its excellent work with Respect and awarded Bronze accreditation by The FA in 2012 and in 2013 with the first Silver accreditation to any league in the county/region. We also support local/national charities through our Charity Cup Competition, raising over £21000 this millennium alone.

Many challenges still lie ahead for the league, including more match officials across all age groups and working towards the Gold Respect accreditation. Our invite by The F.A. to their first Conference for CS junior leagues at St. Georges Park inspires us to continue our commitment to football in the community. Remember "Ability is nothing without opportunity".

# What we do



**Shropshire Junior Football League (formerly Shrewsbury and District Sunday Junior Football League) was founded in the 1973/74 season and is affiliated to the Shropshire Football Association. As a non-profit organisation, with a current turnover of £20,000, it is a constituted league of member clubs who elect officers to administer the affairs and business of the competition on a voluntary basis.**

The League currently has 23 member clubs, all charter standard, of which 2 clubs are Development Status and 6 are Community Clubs. Of the 167 teams, 58 provide mini-soccer (U8 to U10), 40 teams are playing 9v9 football (U11-U12), 69 teams play 11 a-side football and over 2300 registered players are enjoying football in a safe and friendly environment.

A match programme is provided to all age groups including development football for mini soccer (U8-U10) and 9v9 teams (U11) age groups, open competition football for 9v9 (U12) and 11 a-side for U13 to U16 teams. Cup competitions are provided for U11 to U16 teams, with a festival of football finals held over two week-ends at Shrewsbury College, London Road Campus. The league also provides a mid-winter Futsal fairplay festival for U8 to U10 teams and manages the Shropshire Charity Cup Competition for U11, U13 and U14 age groups with the finals held at Ludlow FC Football Stadium. Match officials are appointed to all U16 fixtures, cup matches and finals and the league uses FA Full-Time to generate fixtures with SMS text for results (U12 – U16). SJFL and each member club are committed to promoting inclusivity and to eliminating all forms of discrimination. We support the FA's Respect Code and as such recognise that everyone in football has a collective responsibility to create a fair, safe and enjoyable environment in which the game can take place. All teams must be supervised by two responsible adult members of the club who both hold a valid FA CRB check, the FA Safeguarding Children Workshop qualification and at least one of these adults has completed the FA Level.1 coaching badge and FA Emergency Aid course.

The FA Charter Standard programme is a key aspect to club and league development as grassroots football continues to change, with different formats of the game now being played, irrespective of ability, gender or ethnic origin and the demands for football in a safe and enjoyable environment remain high. The Shropshire Junior Football League is committed to making participation an enjoyable and safe experience for all involved in whatever capacity within the game.

# This year's Guest Speaker



**Matthew "Matt" Le Tissier is a retired English footballer who played for Southampton and England. An attacking midfielder with exceptional technical skills, Le Tissier is the second-highest ever scorer for Southampton behind Mick Channon. He was also the first midfielder to score 100 goals in the Premier League. He is notable for his record at scoring penalty kicks, converting from the spot 47 times from 48 attempts.**

Le Tissier was born in Guernsey, and played youth football on the island with Vale Recreation between the ages of seven and sixteen. He moved to Oxford in 1984 for trials with the football club, but returned to Guernsey a few weeks later suffering from home sickness.

Upon leaving school in 1985 he signed for Southampton on the YTS scheme. The following year Le Tissier made his club debut in a 4–3 defeat at Norwich City in the Football League First Division, and by the end of that season had scored six goals in 12 starts and 12 substitute appearances. He made 19 league appearances in 1987–88, failing to score, but in 1988–89 scored nine times in 21 starts. He was voted PFA Young Player of the Year for the 1989–90 season, in which he was one of the league's top goalscorers with 20 goals.

Undoubtedly the best spell in his career was under the reign of Alan Ball between January 1994 - May 1995, when he scored 45 goals in 64 games in all competitions.

During the season 1994-95, he won the Match of the Day Goal of the Season award for his drifting 40-yard lob against Blackburn Rovers, scoring against his long term friend and former Southampton keeper, Tim Flowers.

He scored the last goal in the final competitive match played at The Dell on 19 May 2001, against Arsenal. This turned out to be his last goal for Southampton.

Le Tissier remained at Southampton for his entire professional career, his loyalty garnering special affection from Southampton's fans who nicknamed him "Le God".

Following retirement Le Tissier had one of the hospitality suites at the St Mary's Stadium named after him, and also an apartment block built on the old site of The Dell.

Since 2005 Matt has been regularly seen every Saturday as part of the team at Sky Soccer Saturday with Jeff Stelling, Phil Thompson, Paul Merson and Charlie Nicholas.

### Rob Orme, Treasurer of SJFL

#### Nomination from SJFL

Rob came into junior football in 1991 as U13 team manager at Up & Comers and continued through to U16 (1994/5), then assistant coach to the club's U18 youth team (1995 - 1997). He is also a Vice President of Up & Comers. In 1993 Rob was elected Treasurer of the SJFL, a position he still meticulously undertakes. Through his tenure with the league he also held positions of FA Delegate to Shropshire FA (1998 to 2004) and currently sits on the Competitions, Rules/ Sanctions and Development committees. Rob was made a Life Member of the SJFL in 2009 for his excellent services to junior football.



### Bernie Butler, Youth Registration Officer and League Delegate to the Shropshire FA

#### Nomination from SJFL

Bernie came into junior football with Baschurch Juniors in 1992, and continued as team manager (U11-U15) until 1997/98 when he was elected onto the SJFL as Press Officer/Results Secretary and Age Rep for U15 age group. In 2004 he was made a Vice President of the league and in 2008 he was elected as the FA Delegate to the Shropshire FA. In 2009 he became Youth Registration Officer - a post he continues to hold. He also sits on the league's Competition and Rules/League Sanctions committees. Bernie was made a Life Member of the SJFL in 2009 for his excellent services to junior football.



### Mike Hames, Chairman of SJFL

#### Nomination from Shrewsbury Up & Comers FC

Mike came into junior football in 1992 as a manager with Up & Comers. He took a team through from U11 to U18, then became Chairman, helping the club become the first in Shrewsbury to attain CS status. He was then made president and is now honorary vice president. Mike was elected Chairman of the SJFL in 2000 and in 2001 he was co-opted onto the Shropshire FA, holding various posts and in 2013 was elected onto the board of directors. He still serves club, league and County FA and was the driving force behind SJFL being recognised by the F.A. as the first Charter Standard Football League in the country in 2009. Mike has led an excellent SJFL management team to win the FA Community County & Regional award for the past three seasons and in 2013 achieved Silver accreditation from the FA for their Respect programme. He was made a life member of the Schools & Colleges FA in 2008 and similarly recognised by SJFL in 2012, also receiving the FA McDonalds Community Award for outstanding contribution to community football.
