THE Shropshire Junior Football League were Wembley winners as they picked up a national award.

League representatives attended the 2019 FA & McDonald's Grassroots Football Awards, held at the national stadium, to collect an award after being named winner of the We Only Do Positive Respect award.

The Shropshire Junior Football League was the first county league to have a Respect partner, the first to deliver the Rainbow Laces/Kick It Out campaign and the first to implement Respect marshals on match days.

Former England women's international Karen Carney presented the award ahead

of the Community Shield between Manchester City and Liverpool.
