The Shropshire Junior Football League dug deep in the time of crisis to continue its unwavering support to important local charities. The coronavirus pandemic wreaked havoc with grassroots football in 2020 with SJFL cancelling all of its leagues, festivals and cup finals from U7s to U16s for the first time in its 46-year history. One of the league's flagship events, the SJFL FA Heads Up Charity Cup finals, would've been hosted at Market Drayton Town FC's Greenfields home at the end of April 2020 with emphasis of those in support of mental health of young people. The league agreed to match fund gate receipts for the event, which was sponsored by the Georgia Williams Trust and Kidz In Focus. SJFL are the only Shropshire league given authorisation to use the FA's Heads Up campaign logos and whilst the finals were cancelled, due to government guidelines, they were rearranged and played on 23rd May 2021 (thanks to Market Drayton Town FC) and the league were united in the decision to pledge crucial financial support to charities in need and, on the day, raised a magnificent £929.00 to PRISM - many thanks for match day donations. In 2020 SJFL donated £2,000 from charity funds and reserves to four charities each receiving £500. Those benefiting were **PRISM, Shrewsbury Foodbank (Barnabas Community Projects), Shropshire SANDS** and **Bradbury House (Action for Children)**. We thank them for the good work they're all doing in these difficult times with Coronavirus and as it is for those who they are helping. For 2021 SJFL has pledged a further £1500 to three charities (each receiving a min of £500) namely PRISM, Shrewsbury Foodbank Plus and Oswestry and Borders Foodbank Plus. These donations will be topped up from gate receipts plus donations made on the day of the finals.



Everyone who wants football to be more inclusive is part of the **#KickItOutGeneration**. If you love the game but don't like the hatred that sometimes goes with it, then you are one of us. If you're under 26 your entire life has been lived in an era when football's equality and inclusion organisation has been actively trying to make the game better for everyone.

Kick It Out is now in its twenty-seventh year and they still hear from thousands of people involved with football at every level. They told of what football means to them and how the drive to eliminate discrimination is bringing hope to people who want to participate in the beautiful game. That, despite high profile incidents of discriminatory abuse or the negativity and hatred thriving on social media, things are slowly getting better. But more needs to be done: Edleen John, FA Director of International Relations, Corporate Affairs and Co-partner for Equality, Diversity and Inclusion, said: "For footballers and many others connected to the game, receiving discriminatory abuse on social media is becoming the norm, and that is simply unacceptable. It's traumatic on a personal level to each individual, and it can have such a damaging impact psychologically to those who receive abuse, alongside their families who often have to support them through this negative experience. The fact that online abuse has no real-world consequences needs to change quickly".

But more work is needed. We need more education and support to help eliminate discrimination. Kick It Out is at the centre of that drive towards progress and all of us together make up the **#KickItOutGeneration**.

We want to make football better for generations to come. And you can help. Get involved using the hashtag **#KickItOutGeneration** and spread our message of equality.


"The parents of our team all thought this was a lovely idea and bought their sons a kit."
