FUTSAL FOR ALL – DISABILITY FUTSAL FESTIVAL FEB 2022

Shropshire Junior Football League sponsored and facilitated a FOOTBALL FOR ALL Futsal festival to give access and opportunity to disability football teams to play futsal in a controlled, safe and friendly environment. The festival, initiated by the junior league, was organised in partnership with Shropshire Football Association, who invited affiliated disability teams and prepared a compatible futsal programme of games hosted by Shrewsbury Sports Village on Sunday 20th Feb 2022. The junior league funded the event from their charity community account which has supported many worthy charities over the seasons including £2093 donated to Shrewsbury and Oswestry Foodbanks last year during the height of the covid pandemic.

Seven teams from across the county (inc. one from Kidderminster) and over 50 players participated in the futsal festival, with each team playing four games. The junior league provided the futsal qualified referees and at the end of the festival presented every player with a medal to recognise their part in this inaugural event. Given the success and positive feedback, the Shropshire Junior Football League has agreed to continue to promote FOOTBALL FOR ALL – Futsal for Disability Teams by sponsoring further events and will look to host these at Shrewsbury Sports Village.

Students embark on Duke of Edinburgh's Awards; take part in competitions; explore new places and discover new hobbies. Our annual student Prom is also supported by Derwen College Charity.





Transport

Vehicles are an essential part of everyday life at Derwen College. Work placements in the community, medical appointments, competitions, new places to visit and explore – our students need to get there! Modified mini buses allow us to provide accessible transport to students who use wheelchairs or have other physical disabilities.

Student accommodation

Many students who study at Derwen College live here too. Providing the right student accommodation for each individual is important.

Learning to look after their personal needs, keeping their home environment clean and tidy, and learning to prepare meals on their own is a big part of life for our students. It prepares them for life after college, and a more independent future.

Donations to Derwen College Charity allow us to upgrade and adapt accommodation to suit the specific needs of our students. Our £1million appeal to upgrade the Agnes Hunt Village bungalows will see significant modernisation of accommodation.

Providing modern home comfort accommodation for students is important to us.

A Bright Future

Derwen College is unique in the variety of work-place training we have on-site for students. Our busy Garden Centre, Garden Café, Orangery Restaurant, Hotel 751 and Karten Print Shop are open to the public and provide invaluable training. These provisions require updating and modifications to ensure they are industry standard. Skills learned in our facilities prepare students for the next stage – work placements in the community.

We regularly speak to industry leaders to ensure our training provisions are up-to-date, appealing to customers and serve as appropriate learning facilities for students.

SJFL CHARITY CUP FESTIVAL OF FINALS 2021

This has been another challenging year with the COVID-19 pandemic, not just for grassroots football but for all walks of society, not least our local communities.

When outdoor grassroots football returned in October 2020 all thoughts then were to complete the football season. However, this was not to be as by November we would enter another Covid Lockdown that was to last through the winter and all grassroots football cancelled for the foreseeable future!

The short dark winter days dragged on for weeks/months and it was not until April 2021 that outdoor grassroots football was allowed to restart under strict Government and FA Covid-19 Guidance. Now came the biggest challenge to Shropshire Junior Football League in its 47-year history. How, what and where could the league implement a fixture programme across all 192 teams from U7 to U16 including cup competition fixtures for the U13 – U16s to finish the season on a high note? With only a few league games played since 2021 October, the league management took the decision to null and void the league programme and concentrate on a Charity Cup competition. With unquestionable support from Market Drayton Town FC, Shrewsbury Town In The Community (STITC Ludlow Stadium) and The New Saints FC (Park Hall Stadium) they all agreed to host a festival of finals. The next stage was to find three local worthy charities to promote at these three stadium venues – and this was not too difficult.

Market Drayton Town FC became the FA Heads Up Campaign and PRISM Telford Charity Finals – £929 raised for this charity

STITC Ludlow became the Shrewsbury Foodbank Plus Charity Finals - £1156 raised for this charity

The New Saints FC became the Oswestry and Borders Foodbank Charity Finals – £937 raised for this charity
